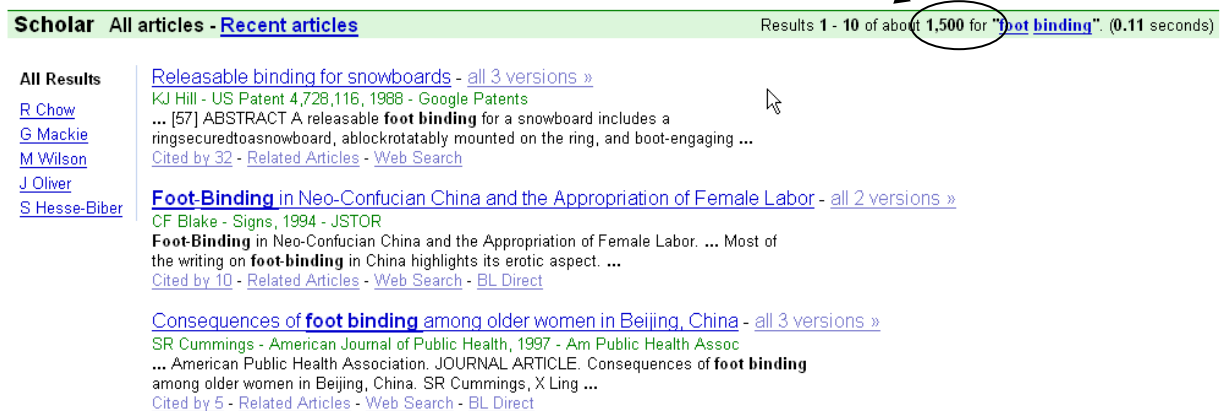


Making Google Scholar Work for You

- Begin at <http://scholar.google.com>
- Type your **topic** or **keywords** in the **Query Box** and then click on the **Search Button**.

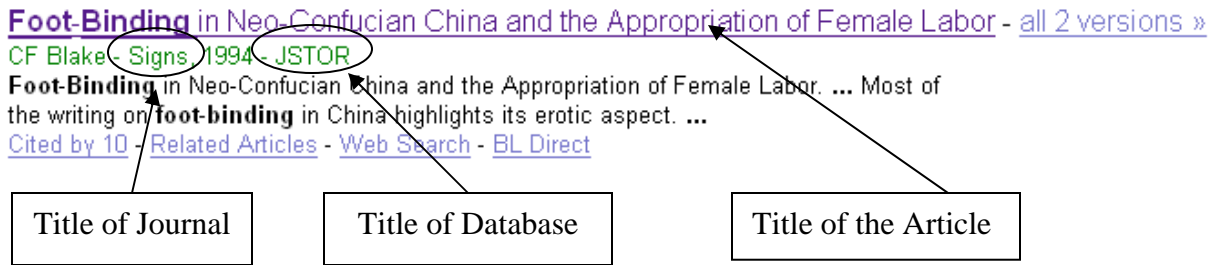



- **NOTE:** If your topic is more than one word put it in quotation marks so that Google keeps the words together. **For example: “foot binding” instead of foot binding.**
- The search for “foot binding” found 1500 items.



- Although the first article on the list does not look applicable or relevant for this search, the second and third articles do.

- This is the second article in the list:



- Google Scholar tells us that it comes from a journal called **Signs**, and is accessible through the **JSTOR database**.
- If you are searching Google Scholar from a computer on Widener's Campus, you can **click on the title of the article and the Full Text of the Article will be displayed**. This happens because this article comes from the **JSTOR database** and the **Wolfgram Memorial Library subscribes to the JSTOR database**.
- **If you are on campus and you click on the title of the article you are interested in and the Full Text of the article is not displayed or if you are searching Google Scholar from off-campus, you will need to following these steps in order to get the Full Text of your article.**
- Open up a second web browser window either by clicking on **File** and then **New Window** in your web browser menu. Or by using the keyboard shortcut **Ctrl and N**.
- In the new browser window, go to the **library homepage** <http://www.widener.edu/libraries/wolfgram>
- In the **Quick Links** section, Click on **WebPAC (Catalog)**.
- In the **More Searches** box, select **Journal Title**, and the click on the . Type in the title of the journal that your article comes from (i.e. *Signs*)

- **Note:** if you were unable to locate any information about the journal your article came out of from WebPAC, this means the library does not subscribe to the journal your article came out of and you will have to put in an Interlibrary Loan Request (Illiad) for the article.
- Since the catalog record includes links to the databases **JSTOR**, **EBSCOHost**, and **Proquest Direct**, we know that the **full text of the journal article is available online by clicking on either if the links in the record.**
- In this case, click on the link to the **JSTOR** database.

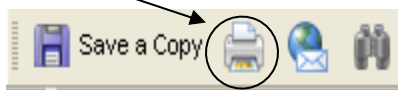

- In the **Search This Journal** box, type in the first few words from the **Title of the Journal Article** you found in Google Scholar. In this case, the title of the journal article is **“Foot-Binding in Neo-Confucian China and the Appropriation of Female Labor.”**
- JSTOR will search for the article in question. When it finds it, JSTOR will give you the bibliographic citation with a link to the **Full Text of the Article**.
