





FULL-TIME ENROLLMENT BY ACADEMIC UNIT AND LEVEL











Trends in First to Second Year Retention





Trends in First to Second Year Retention



First to Second Year Retention Fall 2022 First-Year Class





First-Year Class Four-Year Graduation Rates





First-Year Class Six-Year Graduation Rates













Alumni by State of Residence








